




THE JUBILEE PRAYER

SHEPHERD'S VOICE

Dear & Rev. Fathers / Brothers / Sisters / Laity,

Greetings from Archbishop Bernard Moras, Apostolic Administrator, Mysore.

As we celebrate Easter, may we embrace the hope and peace that Christ offers, living as witnesses of His resurrection and sharing His love with the world.




DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Those of you who are on transfer are requested to keep all the necessary files, parish and institution records, minority files (if there were any minority projects) and books of accounts ready before 30th April 2025.Further, those priests who are on transfer are informed not to take up any construction works whatsoever, nor to introduce any new practice, and not to give any increment in the salary of the staff.

ADMISSION TO MINOR SEMINARY

Canon 233 states that "it is the duty of the whole Christian community to foster vocations to priesthood. In particular this duty binds Christian families, educators and in a special way, priests, especially parish priests ..." All the parish priests are requested to encourage and promote boys who have completed 10th Std., II PUC and any Degree course to join St. Mary's Seminary, Mysore. Even those who have recently written their final exams may seek admissions to the Diocesan Seminary at Mysore. Kindly make the announcements during the Sunday Masses and contact Fr. Jebamalai Muthu, Rector, St. Mary's Seminary to obtain the application forms for the candidates.

ONGOING FORMATION TO THE CLERGY

In Canon Law, the Church emphasizes the importance of "ongoing formation" for clergy as a means of personal, spiritual, theological, and pastoral growth throughout their ministry. The relevant canons from the 1983 Code of Canon Law include:

1. General Requirement for Ongoing Formation

- Canon 279 §1: Clerics are obliged to continue their sacred studies after ordination and to avoid profane novelties. Their studies should focus on Sacred Scripture, Tradition, Liturgy, Canon Law, Theology, and related disciplines.

- Canon 279 §2: They should also pursue deeper knowledge ofhuman sciences, especially those connected to pastoral ministry.

2. Specific Ongoing Formation Programs

- Canon 279 §3: Clerics are encouraged to participate in pastoral lectures, theological meetings, and spiritual retreats.

- Canon 384: The diocesan bishop must ensure that priests continue their formation, including doctrinal, spiritual, and pastoral education.

3. Special Formation After Ordination

- Canon 661: Religious clergy are bound to ongoing formation to renew and perfect their spiritual and apostolic life.

- Canon 815-821: These canons encourage higher ecclesiastical studies and universities for ongoing theological and pastoral education.

4. Formation for Newly Ordained Priests

Some dioceses establish a pastoral year or special programs for newly ordained priests (often referred to as a "priestly internship" or "first five years" formation program), based on the guidelines in Pastores Dabo Vobis (1992) by Pope John Paul II.

Therefore, in our diocese we have planned to have the ongoing formation for all the religious priests serving in the parishes either as Parish Priests or as Asst. Parish Priests in the Diocese of Mysore and the diocesan clergy ordained from 2014 for three days (31st March to 2nd April 2025). All the priests ordained from 2014 and below are expected to participate in the same without any excuse. Programme will be held at Catholic Centre. Please find the details in *Annexure III.*



JUBILEE 2025: PROGRAMS IN THE DIOCESE

Jubilee 2025 is the year of grace, wherein we celebrate the 2025th year of the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ. Every jubilee year is an occasion for us to receive special blessings and indulgences.

In our diocese, we have inaugurated the Jubilee 2025 on 29th December 2024 in a grand and meaningful way. We have had the meeting of the Jubilee Committee members and the Diocesan Secretaries of the Commissions and came out with a Jubilee plan. All the priests, religious and the lay faithful are requested to join hands in celebrating the Jubilee in a meaningful way in our diocese.

ANNEXURE I

MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS P OPE FRANCIS FOR LENT 2025

LET US JOURNEY TOGETHER IN HOPE

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We begin our annual pilgrimage of Lent in faith and hope with the penitential rite of the imposition of ashes. The Church, our mother and teacher, invites us to open our hearts to God's grace, so that we can celebrate with great joy the paschal victory of Christ the Lord over sin and death, which led Saint Paul to exclaim: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (*1 Cor* 15:54-55). Indeed, Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, is the heart of our faith and the pledge of our hope in the Father's great promise, already fulfilled in his beloved Son: life eternal (cf. *Jn* 10:28; 17:3).1

This Lent, as we share in the grace of the Jubilee Year, I would like to propose a few reflections on what it means to *journey together in hope*, and on the summons to conversion that God in his mercy addresses to all of us, as individuals and as a community.

First of all, *to journey*. The Jubilee motto, "Pilgrims of Hope", evokes the lengthy journey of the people of Israel to the Promised Land, as recounted in the Book of Exodus. This arduous path from slavery to freedom was willed and guided by the Lord, who loves his people and remains ever faithful to them. It is hard to think of the biblical exodus without also thinking of

those of our brothers and sisters who in our own day are fleeing situations of misery and violence in search of a better life for themselves and their loved ones. A first call to conversion thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life; each of us is invited to stop and ask how our lives reflect this fact. Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone? Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity? It would be a good Lenten exercise for us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn how to sympathize with their experiences and in this way discover what God is asking of us so that we can better advance on our journey to the house of the Father. This would be a good "examination of conscience" for all of us wayfarers.

Second, to journey together. The Church is called to walk together, to be synodal.2 Christians are called to walk at the side of others, and never as lone travellers. The Holy Spirit impels us not to remain selfabsorbed, but to leave ourselves behind and keep walking towards God and our brothers and sisters.3 Journeying together means consolidating the unity grounded in our common dignity as children of God (cf. *Gal* 3:26-28). It means walking side-by-side, without shoving or stepping on others, without envy or hypocrisy, without letting anyone be left behind or excluded. Let us all walk in the same direction, tending towards the same goal, attentive to one another in love and patience.

This Lent, God is asking us to examine whether in our lives, in our families, in the places where we work and spend our time, we are capable of walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to become self-absorbed and to think only of our own needs. Let us ask ourselves in the presence of the Lord whether, as bishops, priests, consecrated persons and laity in the service of the Kingdom of God, we cooperate with others. Whether we show ourselves welcoming, with concrete gestures, to those both near and far. Whether we make others feel a part of the community or keep them at a distance.4 This, then, is a second call to conversion: a summons to synodality.

Third, let us journey together in hope, for we have been given a promise. May the hope that does not disappoint (cf. Rom 5:5), the central message of the Jubilee,5 be the focus of our Lenten journey towards the victory of Easter. As Pope Benedict XVI taught us in the Encyclical Spe Salvi, "the human being needs unconditional love. He needs the certainty which makes him say: 'neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord' (Rom 8:38-39)".6 Christ, my hope, has risen!7 He lives and reigns in glory. Death has been transformed into triumph, and the faith and great hope of Christians rests in this: the resurrection of Christ!

This, then, is the third call to conversion: a call to hope, to trust in God and his great promise of eternal

life. Let us ask ourselves : Am I convinced that the Lord forgives my sins? Or do I act as if I can save myself? Do I long for salvation and call upon God's help to attain it? Do I concretely experience the hope that enables me to interpret the events of history and inspires in me a commitment to justice and fraternity, to care for our common home and in such a way that no one feels excluded?

Sisters and brothers, thanks to God's love in Jesus Christ, we are sustained in the hope that does not disappoint (cf. *Rom* 5:5). Hope is the "sure and steadfast anchor of the soul".8 It moves the Church to pray for "everyone to be saved" (*1 Tim* 2:4) and to look forward to her being united with Christ, her bridegroom, in the glory of heaven. This was the prayer of Saint Teresa of Avila: "Hope, O my soul, hope. You know neither the day nor the hour. Watch carefully, for everything passes quickly, even though your impatience makes doubtful what is certain, and turns a very short time into a long one" (*The Exclamations of the Soul to God*, 15:3).9

May the Virgin Mary, Mother of Hope, intercede for us and accompany us on our Lenten journey.

Pilgrims of Hope: Discerning the Synodal Path

For we walk by faith, not by sight (2 Cor 5:7)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We, the 145 Archbishops and Bishops representing the 132 dioceses of the Conference of the Catholic Bishops of India (CCBI), gathered at the XIM University, Bhubaneswar, Odisha, for our 36th Plenary Assembly from 28th January to 4th February 2025, send you greetings of Peace, Love and Joy.

The Synod on Synodality, with its emphasis on Communion, Participation and Mission, has deepened our understanding of the Church as the People of God. As a follow-up of the Synod, considering the Final Document of the Synod, we came together to deliberate, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, on how to journey further towards a Synodal Church. The theme of our Plenary was: **Discerning Synodal Pathways for Mission**.

The Church in India embarked upon three journeys towards a synodal Church. First, at the universal level, in response to Pope Francis' call for a synodal Church, the Conference initiated an extensive consultation process from October 2021 to July 2022, culminating in the collation of reports from 130 dioceses into the CCBI's National

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Synthesis (August 2022). Secondly, at the Asian level, the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC), marking its Golden Jubilee, undertook prayerful discernment by representative Bishops of Asian countries, culminating in the FABC Bangkok 50 Document: Journeying Together as Peoples of Asia ... and they went a different way (Matt 2:12) (March 2023). Finally, the CCBI engaged in a massive consultation process, involving close to 5,000 people, culminating in the Pastoral Plan - Journeying Towards a Synodal Church: Mission 2033 (September 2024).

The CCBI reviewed the fruits of these journeys and prepared the Working Document for the Plenary Assembly. The Working Document outlined ten themes which served as a framework for us to engage in prayerful reflection, listening and discernment. The methodology used at the Plenary was "Spiritual Conversation": listening prayerfully to "what the Spirit says to the Churches" (Revelation 2:7). All the participants felt powerfully the movement of the Holy Spirit. The Bishops expressed their intention to use this methodology in all structures of participation, such as parish and diocesan pastoral and financial councils, in arriving at decisions on administration, governance and ministry-related matters that could help the Church immensely.

Searching for synodal pathways for the coming years, we discerned the following themes that would need attention: Faith Formation and Word of God, Children, Family, Youth, Laity, Basic Ecclesial Communities, Migrants and Refugees, Dalits, Tribals/ Adivasis/Indigenous Peoples, Socially Excluded

People, Women and Gender Justice, Poverty and Equitable Economy, Digital Technology and Social Media, Ecology and Climate Stewardship, Ecumenism and Inter-religious Dialogue, and finally, Peacebuilding. The CCBI will soon share in a more elaborate manner the fruits of this Plenary for the benefit of all.

The purpose of the Synod of Bishops was "to plant dreams, draw forth prophecies and visions, allow hope to flourish, inspire trust, bind up wounds, weave together relationships, awaken a dawn of hope, learn from one another, and create a bright resourcefulness that will enlighten minds, warm hearts, give strength to our hands" (Pope Francis' Address at the Opening of the Synod of Bishops on Young People, 3 October 2018).The Synod is not a destiny nor a distant future but a process of active engagement. We see our 36th Plenary Assembly as one step forward in this ongoing process.

With sentiments of deep affection and spiritual closeness, we would like to thank you, the lay faithful, consecrated persons and priests, for your participation in various consultation processes undertaken so far and for your prayers for the Plenary Assembly. In our prayers, we gratefully remembered you, the laity, especially the faithful of Cuttack-Bhubaneswar Archdiocese and, with pain and hope, all those who sacrificed and bore witness to the faith during the Kandhamal persecution.

It is our heartfelt desire that we, as a synodal family, journey towards a synodal Church. We invite committed members of the Church to walk together

as we seek to take new Synodal Pathways for Mission under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. May Mary, Mother of the Church, who walks with us on our pilgrimage, guide us as we embark on a synodal path with missionary zeal as Pilgrims of Hope, especially during this Jubilee Year 2025 and in the coming years.
