


THE JUBILEE PRAYER

NEW AUXILIARY BISHOPS

The Holy Father has appointed Fr. Arokia Raj Satis Kumar (47), the Chancellor of the Archdiocese and Fr. Joseph Soosainathan (60), Parish Priest of the Sacred Heart Church as the Auxiliary Bishops of Bangalore Archdiocese.

Fr. Arokia Raj Satis Kumar was born on 5th September 1977 in Bangalore. He studied Philosophy and Theology at the St. Joseph's Seminary, in the Diocese of Mangalore and was ordained priest on 2nd May 2007 for the Archdiocese of Bangalore.

Fr. Joseph Soosainathan was born on 14th May 1964 in Bangalore. He studied Philosophy at the St. Peter's Pontifical Seminary and Theology at St. Paul's Seminary in the Diocese of Tirucharapalli. He was ordained a priest on 15thMay 1990 for the Archdiocese of Bangalore.

The Archdiocesan territory was formerly part of the Mysore Mission, which was separated from Pondicherry in 1845. The Mysore Mission was elevated to an apostolic vicariate in 1850 and elevated to a diocese with Bangalore as its headquarters in 1886. The diocese of Bangalore was bifurcated from Mysore on February 13, 1940, and it became the Archdiocese in 1953.

Consecration of these Auxiliary Bishops took place on 24th August at a solemn ceremony at St. Francis Xavier Cathedral, Bangalore.
